Southwest Chapter Activities

Many presentations were given and included invasive species removal, rescue techniques and stand-up paddle boarding. Several productive round tables were held which discussed topics such as hazard removal, river ranger minimum qualifications and high water issues encountered this season. A fun filled day was had on the river floating through Browns Canyon with amazing weather, wildlife viewing and of course some great whitewater. The participants used a large variety of boats to navigate the rapids ranging from your standard 14 foot paddle boat to inflatable kayaks, 10 foot R-2 boat, a Super Puma and several kayaks.
